

Available in four weights, Crickle features a roughened outline that gives it an energetic, dynamic look, as if it had been scribbled by a pen. For strikethrough, just place a hyphen (-) after each ~~character~~ character and turn on the ~~is01~~ feature in the OpenType settings of the program ~~you~~ you are using. Each weight comes with an additional experimental font: Crickle Spine (see below).

Crickle Spine is a plain contour to which structures or lines can be added. Simply type your text, convert it to paths and apply a brushstroke or any other (calligraphic) line.

Please note: Spine is experimental! It may or may not work depending on the app and your OS. It does work in Illustrator 2022 on Mac OS 12.

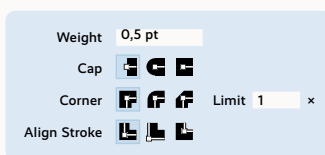

As Crickle Spine is a monoline you have the option of squeezing and slanting it however you like. (But don't try this with other typefaces!)
